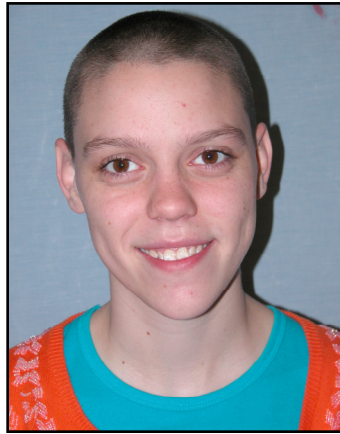

Omaha Central's Molly Mullen has been named this year's Nebraska Student Journalist of the Year.

Mullen has been involved in journalism since her sophomore year at Central High School and has been editor in chief of the *Register* for two years.

Since then the *Register* has won three first place National Best-of-Show awards from the National Scholastic Press Association in Seattle, Chicago, and San Francisco. It has also won two Pacemakers while she was

editor in chief.

Along with many other awards, she also won five medals at the State journalism contest last year as well as having her staff win the overall sweepstakes trophy both years she was in charge. Overall she has won over 50 journalism awards.

This year Molly fought the administration on prior review of the *Register* and source confidentiality and won.

She will be attending the University of Nebraska at Lincoln next year to study journalism.

booklet, the check and the yearbook) postmarked later than June 2 will not be eligible for competition for a Cornhusker Award. Entries received without payment will also be ineligible.

Send the evaluation booklet with staff information provided on the first page, and make any notes to the judges on the appropriate page. Send a school check payable to NHSPA (no purchase orders or personal checks will be accepted) for the correct amount.

Advisers who are not members of NHSPA who wish to have their newspaper critiqued must add \$10 to the totals.

If your yearbook is spring delivery, send it along with the booklet and payment. If your yearbook is fall delivery, mail the booklet and payment

postmarked by June 2, and the yearbook postmarked by Sept. 1, 2006. Any fall yearbooks received postmarked later than Sept. 1 will be ineligible for the Cornhusker competitions, although they still may receive a critique.

A special note to yearbook advisers: Each year many advisers struggle to meet yearbook deadlines, which jeopardize the book's delivery date. Sometimes it is publisher error that delays a yearbook's shipment. We understand and sympathize, but to be fair to all advisers working under equally challenging conditions, no exceptions to these deadlines can be made (even if the yearbook is shipped to you beyond the evaluation deadline). That is yet another unfortunate consequence of a late ship date.

## Schools split into 5 classes for state journalism competition

Nebraska schools are placed into five classes according to their enrollment figures for the current year. Schools with an enrollment of 1,100 students or more are

classified as A1. Schools between 500-1,099 are Class A2, between 201-499 are Class B, between 101-200 are Class C and the remainder are Class D. Schools listed

have registered with the NSAA. Note: total enrollment figures for unisex schools are not doubled for non-athletic activities such as journalism. This year's breakdown:

# JEA Nebraska contest attracts 417 entries
